A Day in the Life: Grace, by Katrina Bergman

I have a very large family. Very large. There are 13 children on my mother's side

and 10 children on my father's side. I counted it up once and I have 64 first cousins. 64. And that's not even counting their children, spouses, my three siblings...well, you get the picture.

One of my fondest memories growing up was communal mealtime where all the family on my dad's side would stuff ourselves into my grandparent's farmhouse and we would fight and love and do life all together for a few short days during the holidays. I come from a long line of smart alecks and it never failed that, right before every single mealtime, all my uncles would start yelling, "Grace! Grace!"

I'm afraid that I was a bit dim. I was constantly trying to figure out which aunt, uncle, or cousin named "Grace" I wasn't remembering. I am embarrassed to say that it wasn't until my adulthood that I realized the part of the conversation I had missed was my grandmother saying it was time to say grace. I am still partly convinced that I have a secret auntie named Grace.

It is not surprising I was confused. Grace is, after all, a fairly common name. It can be a kind of prayer that we speak and something that we hope to receive from those who love us. We can be "graceful," and the bible describes people as having "grace on their lips." (Ps. 45:2) Jesus is described as being full of "grace and truth" (Jn. 1:14) and Stephen was full of "grace and power." (Acts 6:8) Barnabas could see "the grace of God" in the Gentile Christians of Antioch when he went to visit them and see if the Holy Spirit really visited the non-Jews too. (Acts 11:23)

Grace. I was taught that it meant "unmerited favor." Yet, as I read through the above list of all that it is, and I think that definition is flat and devoid of life compared to the richness of what grace means. And I wonder if I understand it any better today than I did all those years ago when my father and uncles were yelling it out before our family meal.
